We're thrilled to share that our 15th year has been our MOST SUCCESSFUL ever! We achieved a 70% growth in revenue, significantly exceeding our stretch goal to become a \$1 million organization.

UGANDA

10 Years of Expanding Impact and Opportunity in Uganda

Our work in Uganda continued to be the biggest contribution to our overall 2024 impact. Much of our success can be attributed to the incredible work of our longtime community partner POPOW. Together, we drilled and fixed wells, built toilets in schools, and delivered education on hygiene and menstrual health – ensuring improved health and brighter futures.

Moving into 2024, we are celebrating 10 years of working with POPOW in Kaberamaido & Kalaki Districts. We also have concrete plans underway to complete an intensive midline study so we can identify gaps and future focus areas, introduce solar powered wells into our solutions, and expand our work into neighboring districts.

We're excited about this partnership's next steps and the continued impact we can make on tens of thousands more in the decades to come!

HAITI

Beyond Unrest: Bringing Health & Hope to Cayes Jacmel

While Haiti continued to make global headlines for its unrest, our work in the remote, rural commune of Cayes Jacmel also continued. Hand-in-hand with our local partner ASSLHA, we brought hope and possibility to tens of thousands of residents.

Working closely with ASSLHA, this past year we continued our hygiene training program and further expanded it to deliver a cholera prevention program that reached 29,600 people with education and resources. This timely intervention helped stop the spread of this deadly and preventable bacterial disease.

We also continued our soap making program, educating 180 people on soap production and providing the tools and resources needed to create businesses and support livelihoods.

With 2024 already underway, our focus is back to building rainwater harvesting systems to ensure communities have the safe water needed for daily hygiene, cooking and health needs.

"Before we received the water tank, we had no water. The children were assigned to bring 5-litre jerry cans everyday to fill the tub in the toilet and to water flowers. Let alone to water the flowers, water for drinking was difficult. As a school committee, we never imagined getting this help. With this water aid, we are very thankful."

INDONESIA

Community-Led Impact: Building Holistic Solutions in Central Sumba

A couple of years after our launch in Indonesia, our work and local partnership with YLRA in Central Sumba continues to strengthen and grow!

It gives us great pride to share that all four elements of Surge's holistic approach are now part of our Indonesia program: water access via wells, rainwater harvesting and filters; construction of school toilets; menstrual health education including reusable pad making; and, most recently, hygiene training. Staying true to our community-led model, YLRA took the lead on incorporating each program component based on community needs.

This past year we also assessed the water, sanitation and hygiene needs for 15 schools and communities. Our goal in 2024 and beyond is to work hand-in-hand with YLRA, the community and government to deliver all of the holistic and comprehensive WASH needs for Central Sumba while assessing expansion in other parts of the island and East Indonesia.



PHILIPPINES

Community Well-Being: Transforming Schools with Safe Water

This past year, we worked hand-in-hand with longtime partner Clean Water International -Philippines (CWIP) to bring safe water to 1,099 people in the remote, rural communities of Pogpog and Melilla Elementary Schools. With these Village BioSand filtration systems, the students and surrounding community now have access to clean, safe water.

Investing in water infrastructure directly impacts the health wellbeing of entire communities – giving them a chance at a more prosperous future! "The significance of this project goes beyond the convenience of having clean water; it touches the very heart of our community's wellbeing. I am profoundly thankful that our school will no longer need to purchase water... It not only relieves us of the financial strain...but also empowers us to redirect funds to other critical projects that our students urgently need."

Sustainable Water for Generations to Come

A primary focus of Surge's work is focused on delivering community and women-centered water infrastructure. What started with small-scale household water purification filters has grown to community-wide solutions, such as wells, rainwater harvesting systems, and filtration systems. Each program is designed to meet the unique needs of the community and counties where we work.

Implementation is only the beginning – the key to long term sustainability is community ownership and ongoing maintenance. At the center of this success are water user committees composed of individuals from the community, who we train to manage and lead water programs in their area. This highly effective, community-led model places the wellbeing and long term sustainability of water sources as its top priority, ensuring the longevity of our solutions. Access to sanitation is a human right, yet in the communities where Surge works, toilets are aging, failing or non-existent. This leads to poor enrollment, attendance and performance – disproportionately affecting school girls.

According to the World Health Organization, "Everybody should care about toilets because public health depends on toilets. Life without a decent toilet is dirty, dangerous and undignified. Unless everybody in a community has a safe toilet, everybody's health is threatened.'

At Surge, we couldn't agree more. This is why we built 17 toilets – 1 in a health center and 16 in schools.

"It was unimaginable to run a school without sanitary facilities and that is why this miracle intervention has brought great relief. The girls had also resorted to dodging school because they lacked convenience during school hours, but that will now definitely come to an end since they now have a modern latrine."

Promoting Health Through Hygiene Education

As part of our holistic work, one of Surge's longest running programs is our interactive, game based programming that educates and reminds children and communities about critical hygiene and sanitation practices. This past year, we reached more than 20,300 people via this program.

Additionally, in the remote, rural communities in Uganda and Haiti where Surge works, families often forgo soap so they can purchase essentials like food or pay school fees. However, soap is the most important part of proper hand washing – reducing diarrhea, a leading cause of death in children under five, by up to 50%.

To help combat this situation, we also have a soap making and distribution program for schools and communities, making this basic need more accessible for tens of thousands annually. Last year, we trained 1,480 people on how to make soap and distributed more than 3,800 gallons.









Creating a Period Friendly World

By educating girls about their menstrual cycles, we're helping them gain a deeper understanding of their bodies and the role menstruation plays throughout their lives. This knowledge improves confidence, self-autonomy, and sexual and reproductive health – and helps remove barriers to girls' education by providing them with the knowledge and tools necessary to safely manage their cycles.

At Surge, our menstrual health program is a component of our holistic women-centered approach – which includes women and girls leading the way to deliver water, sanitation, hygiene and menstrual health solutions for women and girls in their communities. This past year, this education program reached over 9,700 girls through 312 classes in Indonesia and Uganda. "I used to miss school because I didn't have pads to use... I would be scared that the cloth I used would fall at any time. Today I learned how to properly use a piece of cloth"


